Main content and purpose of the plan or programme (e.g., framework setting for projects, determination of use of land) and its links with other plans or programmes	<p>As a Member State of the European Union, Bulgaria shares the common value of developing a fair and prosperous society, with a modern, resource-efficient and competitive economy where there are no net emissions of greenhouse gases in 2050. In accordance with Article 14 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1999, the Republic of Bulgaria undertakes to submit to the European Commission (EC) a draft updated Integrated Energy and Climate Plan (IECP). The updated IECP defines ambitious objectives and measures related to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The transformation process of the national energy mix; • Decarbonisation with sustainable and sufficient emission reductions in the energy sector thanks to new low-carbon technologies and a smooth transition to low-carbon sources; • Adoption of a national climate neutrality target by 2050. <p>The main objectives set out in the IECPs are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stimulating low carbon development of the economy; • Developing competitive and secure energy; • Increasing energy efficiency and reducing carbon emissions, including by exploiting the full potential of natural gas as an energy source and transitional fuel;

Description of the phases of the planning procedure	<p>The draft of the updated IECP in Bulgaria is currently under the strategic environmental procedure (SEA) developed by the Ministry of Environment and Water (MOEW). The title holder of this plan is the MOEW and the Ministry of Energy of the Republic of Bulgaria. The Bulgarian MOEW is in charge with the SEA procedure at national level and with the transboundary SEA procedure, as well. By the present Notification, Bulgaria is applying the transboundary SEA procedure with the countries that are likely to be affected by the Plan. If the notified countries respond that they participate in this procedure, Bulgaria expects comments and points of views from the affected public and from the authorities of the affected Parties.</p> <p>A public hearing will be organized at the request of the affected parties.</p> <p>After the SEA procedure is closed, the Bulgarian State Authorities will adopt the Plan by Governmental Decision.</p> <p>The planning procedure consists in the following stages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Elaboration of IECP, updated 2024. - Conducting the SEA procedure at national level and in a transboundary context – in case of necessity. - Taking into consideration the results of the national and transboundary consultations (in case of necessity). - Completion of the SEA procedure and issuance of Statement on Ecological Assessment by the Minister of Environment and Waters. - Adoption of the draft of IECP in Bulgaria by the Bulgarian Government Decision.

the affected Party	<p>According to the Environmental Protection Act (EPA, transposing the Directive 2001/42/CE) the SEA procedure incorporates the procedure for Appropriate Assessment and in the concrete case the AAR for the Plan will be the first document subject of submission under the SEA procedure. Once the MOEW gives a positive assessment of the quality of the AAR than the consultations on the SEA Report can start. In case of a transboundary procedure the both reports will be sent to the affected parties for consultations as well. All comments and opinions will be sent to the Bulgarian MOEW to be taken into account in the SEA procedure.</p> <p>The final SEA decision – Statement on Ecological Assessment regarding the draft of IECF will be made available to the countries that are likely to be affected by the plan.</p>
