**Dear Ms. Mocanu,**

Thank you for submitting your position, transmitted on 6 February 2026 under reference number *DGEICPSC/124786/05.02.2026*, within the framework of the ongoing environmental impact assessment procedure in a transboundary context for the Corvinus Project. The timely provision of this information is greatly appreciated.

The comments detailed in the position have been forwarded to the competent environmental authority for substantive assessment. In consultation with the relevant authorities, a coordinated response addressing the proposals and comments set out in the Romanian position has been prepared and is hereby transmitted as a courtesy translation.

By transmitting this supplementary information, Hungary considers that it has complied with the requirements of the Espoo Convention and has provided all available information to Romania, having participated as a potentially affected Party in accordance with the Convention. All relevant comments will be taken into consideration in the environmental license to be issued for the commencement of the planned activity.

In view of the above, Hungary considers the transboundary phase of the EIA procedure to be closed.

Upon its issuance, Hungary shall transmit the decision of the environmental authority concerning the commencement of the planned activity to Romania, in accordance with the provisions of Article 9 of *Directive 2011/92/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council on the assessment of the effects of certain public and private projects on the environment*, and Article 6 of the *Convention on Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context*, signed in Espoo on 26 February 1991.

Your cooperative engagement during the transboundary leg of the procedure is appreciated.
