Referring to your letter of 31 March 2025 (Ref. No. DGEICPSC/126696/28.03.2025), Hungary hereby notifies you, in accordance with the Espoo Convention (Convention on Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context, signed in Espoo on 25 February 1991) and the EIA Directive (Directive 2011/92/EU), that an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) procedure for the "Nyékpuszta Corvinus Project" (hereinafter: "Corvinus Project") has recently been launched.

To initiate the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) procedure this procedure, the proponent has submitted an **application for development consent**, **accompanied by the Environmental Impact Assessment Report** (hereinafter referred to as the "EIA Report"), to the competent Hungarian authority, the Government Office of Békés County (Békés Vármegyei Kormányhivatal).

We would appreciate receiving confirmation, at your earliest convenience, as to whether Romania intends to participate in the transboundary Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) procedure for the *Corvinus Project*, in accordance with the Espoo Convention.

In case Romania cannot exclude the possibility of significant transboundary adverse environmental impacts of the proposed project — despite the project developer's declaration included in the documentation — and decides to participate in the EIA procedure as an Affected Party, comments on the available documentation should be submitted by 29 January 2026 at the latest. Please note that comments received after this deadline may not be taken into account.

To facilitate the effective involvement of the public and the competent authorities, all documentation required for publication – in Romanian, English and Hungarian – has been provided in a publication-ready format, so that the Romanian Party does not need to carry out any further preparatory tasks for public disclosure. In light of the above, we kindly request that Romania's response be submitted by the indicated deadline, in order to ensure that the transboundary phase of the EIA procedure can proceed without delay.

In case of participation in the EIA procedure in a transboundary context, to ensure compliance with Article 3(8) of the Espoo Convention, please make the linked documentation promptly available to the relevant public in your country. According to Hungarian national legislation (Governmental Decree No. 314/2005. (XII. 25.) on environmental impact assessment and on integrated environmental usage permitting process), the documentation must be published on the website of the relevant regional environmental authority for 30 days. Please allow the same time period for comments in your country.
